- SIGNAL LIGHT / CAMERA CONTROL PROCEDURES:**
- PROCEDURES FOR ALL JURISDICTIONS**
 Each signaled intersection light has a control box near the intersection that serves to operate the signals. Police supervisors are issued keys that open signal light control boxes. The signals can be changed to 4-way flash by flipping the associated toggle switch in the control box.
- Staffing at intersections that are significant entry and exit points should consist of 2 police/fire personnel, which can include SHARPs, CSO, officers or any other competent personnel.

- SPECIAL CONSIDERATION**
 Planning Considerations for Flood Fight Operations
- LEVEE PATROL (ALL SECTORS)**
 Reclamation District vehicles will conduct ongoing, periodic, levee patrols along tops of levees on San Joaquin River and French Camp Slough. Vehicles will access levee top through Levee Access Points 1 and 9.
- Provide for access through control points and keep levee tops clear.
- EMERGENCY WORK (ALL SECTORS)**
 Heavy vehicles may need access to any part of levee during evacuation and security operations to perform emergency work.
- Identify ingress/egress route(s) for heavy equipment with RD 17 officials. Coordinate access plan with other sector commands.
- RD17 RELIEF CUT**
 In the event of levee failure, a relief cut will be made where indicated on map. Expect heavy destruction of structures within 1/4 mile of relief cut after it is made from outflow of water. Expect movement of heavy equipment to relief cut vicinity prior to and/or after levee failure.
- Identify ingress/egress route(s) for heavy equipment to site and staging area at site with RD17 officials.
- High priority to evacuation/rescuing all persons from structures within 1/4 mile of cut in event of levee failure.
- UNDERPASS EMERGENCY BERMS (ALL SECTORS)**
 In event of levee failure, one or more emergency berms may be constructed to contain flood waters.
 Preliminary work may be started prior to actual break.
 Check Area Command for timing of initiating construction of berms.
 Plan for heavy equipment access to berm sites while evacuation traffic outflow is in progress.
 Coordinate with Area Command for timing of closing of underpass routes to allow final closure of berms.

- EMERGENCY BROADCASTS TO PUBLIC**
 All messages for following three systems are developed by the Joint Information Center (JIC) at the San Joaquin Operational Area Emergency Operations Center.
- Emergency Alert System (EAS)**
 Provides immediate access to commercial radio and TV broadcasters for short messages and instructions. Primary control station is KFBK, 1530 AM. CAS transmitters located at San Joaquin Operational Area EOC, Sheriff's Communications Center, and at control station KFBK, 1530 AM.
- San Joaquin County public and private schools (K-12) have EAS receivers that will sound an alert tone and record messages for replay when Sheriff or Operational Area transmitters are used.
- Telephone Notification Systems (TENS)**
 Automatic dialing system which telephones a designated geographical area and plays a short recorded message if phone is answered. System control is at the dispatch center of agencies with systems in place.
- Stockton Police Department - Stockton coverage and backup for Sheriff
 San Joaquin County Sheriff - Countywide coverage
 Manteca Police Department - Manteca coverage
- Mobile Emergency Advisory Radio System (EARS)**
 Low power trailer mounted AM radio transmitter for continuous broadcast of moderate length or multiple short messages to public. Good reception up to a 2 mile radius with car radio or 1/2 mile radius standing outside with good portable AM radio. Field Incident Command deploys and secures unit. JIC develops message and programs by telephone or a site. Three (3) units are immediately available.
